Do I have to be married?

No. You can be married, single, widowed or divorced.

Can I have children of my own?

Yes! Our teens will benefit from having a relationship with all members of your family.

Can the teens be involved in community activities?

Absolutely! We want our teens to be involved in the typical activities of other youth their age: sports, music, volunteering, after-school jobs, friends, faith-based activities, etc.

What needs do the teens have?

Like any teen, they need acceptance, encouragement and guidance. In addition, teens in foster care have experienced trauma in their lives and need help trusting again, building relationships, and gaining positive self-esteem and confidence.

WHO ARE THE TEENS?

The teens, ages 12-17, are youth who cannot remain in their home due to abuse, neglect or conflict. These youth are no different from any other teens. They attend the same schools and have the same extracurricular activities and interests as other youth in your community.

Being a teen doesn't mean you do not need a family. It is even more important to have guidance and stability to navigate into adulthood.

Young adults, ages 18-21, need your help too. These young adults have spent the last few years in foster care and are in need of a "host home" to support them while they continue their education and prepare to live independently.
