RESTRAINT TECHNIQUE TRAINING	RESTRAINTS ARE ONLY TO BE USED BY EMPLOYEES TRAINED BY A CERTIFIED TRAINER UNDER A PROGRAM ON THE STATE-APPROVED LIST BELOW.
<u>Crisis Prevention Institute</u> (CPI)	CPI is an international training organization that specializes in the safe management of disruptive and assaultive behavior. CPI provides safe behavior management best practices and innovative resources to professionals around the world who are committed to creating safe and respectful work environments.
Therapeutic Crisis Intervention (TCI)	Therapeutic Crisis Intervention is a training program of the Cornell University Family Life Development Center and is designed to provide staff and parents with skills, knowledge and confidence to deal with children in crisis, to be in control in a crisis situation, and to help a child to learn and grow from the experience.
Prevention and Management of Aggressive Behavior (PMAB)	PMAB training is designed to provide staff members with the skills needed to manage aggressive clients safely. Proper training helps staff members identify behaviors that indicate that aggressive behavior is escalating and gives them techniques for preventing and managing that escalation.
<u>Handle With Care Behavior</u> <u>Management System</u> (HCW)	HWC includes a full spectrum of interventions including effective standing, seated and floor restraint along with a verbal de-escalation program.
Safe Crisis Management (SCM)	Safe Crisis Management is a Comprehensive Training Program focused on Preventing and Managing Crisis and Improving Safety in Facilities and Schools.
Managing Aggressive Behavior (MAB)	Managing Aggressive Behavior (MAB) is a nationally recognized crisis management program developed through the University of Oklahoma, National Resource Center for Youth Services (NRCYS). The MAB program emphasizes prevention and non-physical intervention strategies, and teaches non-pain producing physical intervention techniques to protect

youth and staff alike. MAB can help you establish agency-wide procedures that will reduce the number of restraints and offers an after-crisis component that
helps staff learn from each event.

Any use of restraint models not listed here must be approved by the <u>Dept. of Children and Family Services</u> Licensing Section prior to implementation or the use of any physical restraints.
